Thoughts from the Minister:

Fear and Politics and Easter

Recently, Ted Cruz announced his candidacy for President. The Wall Street Journal headlined an article about Senator Cruz's campaign saying that he was in step with his party's "fears." Polling, the article said, shows the partisan breakdown of fear that another terrorist attack could be directed at the U.S. Specifically, 72% of Republicans said they fear another attack, compared to 39% of Democrats and 55% of independents.

Halfway across the world, and a week earlier, Israeli Prime Minister Netanyahu won re-election. Al Jazeera reported on his campaign tactics, referring to them as the "gospel of xenophobia" and the "politics of fear."

Let me be clear. Republicans and Israelis do not have a monopoly on fear. Democrats, independents, Libertarians, and Green Party members have fears too. Kenyans, Brazilians, Canadians and Indonesians all have fears. Fear is part of the universal human condition.

But fear does not define us.

Early this month we will celebrate Easter. The fantastic story of life overcoming death, of faith overcoming fear.

The Easter story says that when Jesus' friends went to the tomb to tend to his dead body, he was not there. Holy messengers showed up to say, "Do not be afraid."

A great deal of ink (and even blood) has been spilled over the centuries, trying to explain what happened at that empty Easter tomb. Some people claim bodily resurrection, others tout resuscitation; some say the whole story is nonsense. Whatever biological facts we yearn for, the message of Easter is deeper and broader: "Do not be afraid." Wherever Jesus was on that Easter morning, he was with God.

The Apostle Paul that "whether we live or die we belong to Jesus." To me that means we belong to the same realm, to God's realm. We belong to the eternity of goodness and grace and justice and peace that are synonymous with God.

Sure, I worry about ISIS and the state of the world. I worry about Palestine and Israel. I worry about the safety and wellbeing of the world. I worry about my children and my spouse. I worry about you, dear Westmorelander, who reads this column. But I pray that my worry does not devolve into fear. To me that is the difference between worry and fear. Worry calls us to act and to care. Fear paralyzes us or pushes us to unhealthy action.

In the face of our worries and our fears, the Gospel words sing out: "Fear not." Our lives are not defined by polls or politics. Nations and kingdoms and caliphates come and go. Soldiers and senators and presidents and prime ministers rise and fall. We do not belong to them. We belong to God. In this life and in any life that is beyond this life, we belong to Love.

Do not be afraid. Christ is Risen. Happy Easter!

Stop Hunger Now! Meal-Packing Event

Sunday, April 26, 11:30am

Westmorelanders of all ages are invited to take part in a hands-on mission project together with Stop Hunger Now. Stop Hunger Now is an organization that aims to alleviate global hunger by sending meals and other aid to children and families all over the world. How do they do it? Stop Hunger Now sponsors meal-packing events with churches, schools, and other volunteer organizations to assemble millions of meals that can be shipped to partner organizations in other countries.



During a meal-packing event, several "packing teams" of 10-12 volunteers each work together to fill bins with raw ingredients, scoop ingredients into meal bags, weigh and seal the bags, box and stack them on pallets, and load the pallets and equipment onto a truck. The assembly process combines rice, soy, dehydrated vegetables and a flavoring mix that includes 23 essential vitamins and minerals into small meal packages. The meals are then shipped throughout the world to support school feeding programs, orphanages and crisis relief. The food is stored easily, transported quickly, and has a shelf-life of two years.

Westmoreland has committed to preparing 10,000 meals on April 26th and we need your help! Please plan on staying after worship for 1-2 hours to join in the meal-packing event. There are roles for everyone—from 5 to 105 years old—in this activity, and will be a fun way for all of us to learn more about global hunger and teamwork together! Their programs shelter, clothe, and feed our neighbors in need and provide supportive services with the goal of helping them achieve self-sufficiency. Westmoreland Church is one of the founding congregations of Interfaith Works.

In April, we will continue to help Interfaith Works clients by collecting items for newborns, in honor of Mother's Day. Please consider donating some of the following items: baby blankets, onesies, hats, pacifiers, baby wipes, bottles. Below is a preview of collections planned for 2015:

- April** Baby layette items for Mother Day gifts to Interfaith Works clients.
- May** Deodorant, razors, toothbrushes and toothpaste for clients of Bethesda Cares, a non-profit that helps the homeless and persons in need and helps prevent homelessness in Montgomery County.
- June** Tuna cans, boxes of cold cereal (any type), bags of ground coffee (perhaps Cafe Justo!) for clients of So Others Might Eat (S.O.M.E.), an interfaith, community-based organization that meets daily needs of food, clothing and health care of Washington, DC clients.
- July** School supplies (we will provide a list of needed items to be announced in May) to benefit Shaw Community Ministries, a ministry of the Potomac Association of the United Church of Christ, who works together with the children, youth, adults and seniors of the Shaw community of Washington, DC to enhance lives and to expand opportunities in the areas of: education, health and wellness, leadership and youth development.
- August** Stickers for Beth Ferris, Westmorelander and Co-Director of the Brookings-LSE Project on Internal Displacement, to distribute to refugee children in the middle east. More information to come.
- September** Small soaps and shampoo (unopened from hotel rooms or similar size) for clients of Martha's Table, who helps build better future for DC children, families and neighbors in need by increasing access to Healthy Starts, Healthy Eating, and Healthy Connections.
- October** Items for Thanksgiving baskets for Shaw Community Ministry
- November** Books or other designated gift items (from the organization) for Anacostia Health Clinic Christmas Gift Collection
- December** Socks for adult and children clients of Bethesda Cares



Thank you to everyone who contributed to the youth group coffee hour on March 22! Our youth raised \$847.78 to benefit Stop Hunger Now! On April 26, the congregation is invited to join the youth in packaging 10,000 meals after worship. Stop Hunger Now will then send those meals to people in need around the world. Westmorelanders Propose Resolution on Death-with-Dignity

Several members of Westmoreland, along with Rev. Tim Tutt and former Rev. Gordon Forbes, have signed a proposed resolution supporting death-with-dignity – also known as physician-assisted-dying – for consideration at the annual meeting of the Central Atlantic Conference in June.

The Conference adopted a similar resolution in 2009 that was referred to the General Synod that year. The General Synod asked the UCC Justice and Witness Ministries staff to convene a working group to deliberate. The group produced a study guide for congregations and associations to use but remained divided on the question of legalizing physician-assisted-dying and made no recommendation to the 2011 General Synod on the policy proposal. In the meantime, bills have been introduced in more than a dozen legislative bodies, including Maryland and the District of Columbia, and Vermont has joined Oregon and Washington in authorizing procedures. These procedures require a person who wishes physician assistance to be at least 18 years old, to be diagnosed as terminally ill and expected to die within six months, and to make two oral requests, fifteen days apart, and one written request for a doctor to issue a prescription for a lethal drug which the person must take voluntarily, without assistance.

The proposed resolution recites these facts, re-affirms the substance of both the theological statement and the text of the 2009 Conference resolution, requests the Conference Minister to send the resolution to the governors of the six states in the Conference (and to the sponsors of the bills pending in four of those states), and asks the Conference board of directors to submit the resolution for consideration by the 31st General Synod, which will be held in Baltimore in 2017.

In March Rev. Alex Vishio of the Conference staff submitted testimony in support of Senate Bill 676, the death-with-dignity bill that has been introduced in the Maryland Senate.

Potomac Association Spring Meeting - New Location


